ENTERTAINING ANGELS

Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels. (Hebrews 13:2)

Biblical hospitality means much more than serving punch and cookies. It is essentially an attitude of openness toward life—all of life. Hospitality means welcoming life with its gifts and its limitations. It means embracing the particular life that is mine, not the one I wish I had. Hospitality also means I eagerly welcome others into my life—my spouse, children, friends, coworkers, strangers and even apparent enemies. When I practice hospitality, I also accept the times in which I live with their inherent trials and struggles as well as their blessings and joys.

Why is hospitality so vital to the spiritual life? Because God is present in our life—sometimes comforting, other times challenging us. We can waste valuable energy pining away for a life that used to be, or for a life that will never be, instead of being open to the incredible mystery that is our life today. By being more hospitable to the people and events of our every-day life, we may actually run into an angel or two—and perhaps even God.

RECOGNIZING THE EVER-PRESENT JESUS

As they were leaving the boat, people immediately recognized him.

Often we pray that Jesus be with us, maybe at the dinner table in the midst of a family argument, when in reality Jesus is sitting across the table from us. Or we pray that God help our sick mother when in reality Jesus is already next to her. Or that peace be restored between two persons when in reality Jesus *is* the peace between them. Sometimes we pray that a neighbor be consoled after losing everything in a fire instead of also taking a pie to that neighbor affording them the chance to grieve aloud. Or we pray for help for a father of two children whose wife walked out on them instead of also meeting with the father and offering to baby-sit. Or hoping a child will do better on the next exam instead of also offering to tutor the child. We can count on Jesus being present with the lonely, the widowed, the sick, the struggling. We just need to recognize him in these disguises and go there.
