MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day is said to have begun in Waterloo, N.Y., where, on May 5, 1866, the citizens honored the graves of the Civil War dead and flew the flags at half-mast.

Two years later, an organization of army veterans designated May 30 "for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who had died." It came to be known as "Decoration Day."

Memorial Day is now a national holiday commemorating all who died in war, celebrated on the last Monday of May.

GOD BLESS AMERICA

Composer Irving Berlin first wrote "God Bless America" in 1918 as part of his musical review, "Tip, Tap, Yaphank", for Camp Upton, located in Yaphank, Long Island. But the song never made the cut, and Berlin tucked it away.

In the fall of 1938, as the world moved closer to war, Berlin decided to write a song about peace. He revised his patriotic song from Camp Upton days, and with a few alterations, made it more relevant for the times.

The revised version of "God Bless America" was introduced by singer Kate Smith during her radio broadcast on Armistice Day, Nov. 11, 1938.
