FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

CSA- We are in the midst of our annual CSA drive. All parishioners should have received a LETTER FROM BISHOP CARLSON promoting this year's CSA.

Our goal is \$48,500. At this time we are a little more than halfway to the goal. If you haven't already responded to the Appeal, please do so as soon as possible.

Our appeal runs through the month of JUNE. At the end of the month we will begin contacting parishioners who have not yet responded.

MAINTENANCE CONCERNS:

We have a beautiful physical plant here at Sacred Heart—with a nice church, parish center and rectory. As we reflect upon these gifts, please keep in mind they need constant maintenance. All of our buildings are getting OLDER: the church is close to fifty years old, the parish center is 60 plus.

At the present time our PARKING LOTS are in need of maintenance. There are many cracks and emerging potholes. Therefore, it is necessary to give it some attention. I have asked members of the Staff, Administration Committee, Planning Committee and Parish Council to assist me in making the most prudent decision.

There are two possible OPTIONS. The first is to lay down a 1½ inch layer of asphalt and roll it out. This would give the LOTS approximately 10-15 years of additional usage. The cost is approximately \$50,000.00. We are leaning toward doing this.

Please keep in mind that our LOTS are too far gone to simply apply a SEALCOATING. And since there is ongoing discussion by the Planning Committee about FUTURE construction...by doing this OPTION it would give a window of 10-15 years for planning.

OPTION 2 is to completely pulverize the lots, grade and apply 3 inches of asphalt. The cost is between \$77,000.00 and \$109,000.00. This OPTION is much more permanent and therefore would be too great of expense...especially as we continue to contemplate a possible new parish center in the future.

NEW PARISH ROOF-In the next 3-5 years we will be looking at putting a new roof on the parish center. There have been some leaks...and we have been able to patch them. Yet the roof is OLD and in time will need some maintenance. Monies for the parking lots would come from our parish savings. (In Christ's Peace, Fr. Dennis)

TRINITY SUNDAY (Matthew 28: 16-20)

Since Jesus was Jewish, we shouldn't be surprised that most of his active ministry took place in Jewish cities. Rarely do we find him preaching or healing in non-Jewish (Gentile) territory. From the Acts of the Apostles, we learn that the early Christians, like Jesus, also preached mainly to the Jews.

Being God's chosen people, many Jews believed they were God's instruments in the world and that God planned to work through them in a special way. Basing their conclusions on Scripture, some rabbis taught that God intended to send the Jewish people a messiah who would conquer and rule the world through them.

The Jews were understandably proud of their status as God's favorite nation but their pride sometimes led to snobbishness. Many Jews did not want anything to do with Gentiles and even believed contact with Gentiles made them ritually impure. Therefore, pious Jews didn't talk to Gentiles and didn't associate with them in any way. After passing through Gentile territory, some Jews even shook the dirt from their sandals before stepping onto Jewish soil because they did not want the Promised Land contaminated by Gentile dust.

Since most early Christians were Jews who shared these attitudes (no, they weren't perfect), they initially limited their preaching to the Jewish people. Only later did the early Christians understand Jesus' command to make disciples of *all* nations and begin preaching to all people, not just to the Jews. We don't have much biblical evidence about what most of the apostles did or where they went after they received the gift of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, but tradition tells us they took Jesus' words seriously and traveled to distant lands to preach the Gospel.
